Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Anthony Woods and asked that he provide the invocation and to be sure and remember the family of Nikki Peele due to the death of her mom, as well as the families that lost two children in an automobile accident earlier in the day.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA ITEMS

**Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Mr. Charles P. Midgley, Jr., to approve the agenda as presented. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

PUBLIC HEARING

ORDINANCE # 759 – AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR AN ANNUAL SOLID WASTE FEE

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, opened the public hearing and recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, County Administrator, to make comments on Ordinance # 759.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that the Ordinance being discussed was for the Solid Waste Fee which would authorize a \$40 fee to be applied to all dwellings in the unincorporated areas of the county. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this would include legal residences, mobile homes and any other property that could serve as a dwelling to include rental houses.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that the estimated number of dwellings to which the fee would be applied was 7,500 and the fee would generate an estimated \$300,000 in revenue for the county. He stated that the fee would be included as a separate item on the property tax notices for all property owners that have dwellings in the unincorporated areas of the county. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this fee was included in Council's budget process for the budget which was recently adopted and the fee is to be reviewed annually with the budget. He stated that the fee could be increased or decreased and Council would also have the option of assessing this fee to those dwellings that are located in municipalities at a later time.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that the proposed uses for the revenue from this fee would include:

- Renovation and reconfiguration of existing convenience center operation. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that staff would need to look at making unloading easier and to ensure that the county has convenience centers in the right locations. He stated that the convenience centers would be accepting items like couches, sofas, computer monitors, tires and things like that at no charge from those that pay the solid waste fee. He stated the he hoped that this would help with the cleanup of the county since folks will have a place to take items they no longer want or need.
- Clean-up effort. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that a work crew could be organized with a supervisor to be hired along with the appropriate equipment to be purchased for the clean-up of the county. He stated that a "hot line" email might be created to log and address problem areas that public folks may recognize. He stated that a portion of the fees might be used to support neighborhood clean-up efforts and provide dumpsters when needed when cleaning up areas with much debris.
- Public information and education campaign. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that materials could be provided to schools to help educate our children about the importance of keeping our county clean and maximize the use of grant funds for billboard and signage to make folks aware and remind them that we can all work to keep Marlboro County clean.
- Enforcement of existing litter laws. Mr. Munnerlyn mentioned undercover operations to catch some of the folks that are dumping debris in the county and possible funding of another officer. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that Mr. Keith Williams was the only Environmental Control officer that the county had and he covers the

entire county. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that it may be that we will need to hire another officer to assist with the litter control and enforcement.

Mr. Munnerlyn asked if there were any questions.

Mr. Anthony Woods asked how the convenience center folks would know which folks were city residents and who were county residents when they take items to the landfill. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that was a good question and he stated that the attendants would have lists of county residents by name and as well as address to insure that they were in fact residents in unincorporated areas.

Chairman Steen stated that one individual had signed up to speak regarding this Ordinance and recognized Mr. Richard Hale.

Mr. Richard Hale asked if this fee would be replacing the county's roll out carts. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that it would not and that the cart system would still be in place for residential trash.

Mr. Hale then asked if the fees would allow for the clean-up of the terrible eye sore in the firestone community. He stated that it really needed to be cleaned up.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that his goal would be to clean up some of the "eye sores" in the county to the extent possible. He stated that these type of areas would be looked at most definitely.

Mr. Hale stated that he had visited many different places and Marlboro County has definitely been going down for some time. He stated that he was ashamed of areas in the county. He stated that firestone looked good at one time and stated that by cleaning that one area up would help that community a great deal.

Chairman Steen thanked Mr. Hale for speaking and sharing his concerns. He stated that Council wanted the community's involvement and welcomed it.

Chairman Steen stated that he spoke with one citizen in his district that was on a fixed income. He stated that the citizen agreed that we needed to take care of our communities and clean up needed to be done. Chairman Steen stated that those in his district seemed to be very understanding and wants the county cleaned up.

Chairman Steen stated that Council looks forward to seeing something positive in the future.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any further questions or comments. There were none.

ORDINANCE # 760 – AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MARLBORO COUNTY AND FLAKEBOARD AMERICA LIMITED D/B/A ARAUCO, NORTH AMERICA OF PROPERTY ON MAPLE STREET (FORMER BORO PROPERTY)

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Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, opened the public hearing and recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, County Administrator, to make comments on Ordinance # 760.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this was the final reading of the six month lease between the County and Flakeboard America Limited d/b/a Arauco, North America on property formerly known as the Boro property. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that no changes had been made to the lease since the last reading and he was happy to have a tenant in that location.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any comments or questions from the public or council members on this Ordinance. There were no comments.

The Public Hearing was closed.

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, asked if there were any comments on the minutes or suggested changes or additions. There were no recommended changes.

OLD BUSINESS

ORDINANCE # 759 – AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR AN ANNUAL SOLID WASTE FEE – THIRD READING

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, stated that comments were made on this Ordinance during the Public Hearing and asked if there were any additional questions or comments. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Mr. Charles P. Midgley, Jr., to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 759 – an Ordinance to provide for an annual Solid Waste Fee. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

ORDINANCE # 760 – AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MARLBORO COUNTY AND FLAKEBOARD AMERICA LIMITED D/B/A

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ARAUCO, NORTH AMERICA OF PROPERTY ON MAPLE STREET (FORMER BORO PROPERTY) – THIRD READING

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, stated that comments were made on this Ordinance during the Public Hearing and asked if there were any additional questions or comments. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Verd Odom, seconded by Mr. Steve Blackmon, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 760 – an Ordinance to approve the lease agreement between Marlboro County and Flakeboard America Limited d/b/a Arauco, North America of property on Maple Street (former Boro property) and further ratifies the lease which has been prepared in connection with said Ordinance. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

NEW BUSINESS

ORDINANCE # 761 – AN ORDINANCE ENLARGING THE BOUNDARIES OF THAT JOINT COUNTY INDUSTRIAL AND BUSINESS PARK WITH DILLON COUNTY AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO – FIRST READING

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, to make comments on this Ordinance.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this Ordinance was related to the Harbor Freight expansion where new property was acquired and the new property was being added as a part of the Industrial Park. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that there were no costs to Marlboro County but that the county would eventually receive some revenue from this expansion. He recommended Council approve the first reading of this Ordinance.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Steve Blackmon, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve the first reading of Ordinance # 761 – an Ordinance Enlarging the Boundaries of that Joint County Industrial and business Park with Dillon County and Other Matters Related Thereto. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

ORDINANCE # 762 – AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE # 753 TO ALLOW THE TRANSFER OF THE FORMER WINN-DIXIE BUILDING TO NORTHEASTERN TECHNICAL COLLEGE OR THE NORTHEASTERN TECHNICAL COLLEGE FOUNDATION – FIRST READING (TITLE ONLY)

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, County Administrator, to make comments on this Ordinance.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this request came to his attention at the last minute. He stated that Marlboro County recently approved the transfer of the old Winn-Dixie building to Northeastern Technical College in exchange of the title to the library and the existing tech building. He stated that the prior Ordinance called for a transfer to Northeastern Technical

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College which is state-owned. The state has suggested that Marlboro County amend its Ordinance to allow for the transfer to be made to Northeastern Technical College Foundation rather than the College itself. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that the county attorney has not had an opportunity to review and for this reason, the Ordinance was by title only. He stated that the county attorney would have a written drafted Ordinance for council to review by the second reading.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any questions. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Mr. Charles P. Midgley, Jr., to approve the first reading in title only of Ordinance # 762 – an Ordinance Amending Ordinance # 753 to Allow the Transfer of the Former Winn-Dixie Building to Northeastern Technical College or the Northeastern Technical College Foundation. Motion in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

RESOLUTION # 08-17-01 – A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE MARLBORO COUNTY TO EXECUTE A BOUNDARY LINE AGREEMENT TO CONFIRM THE WIDTH OF A RAILROAD RIGHT OF WAY EASEMENT

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, County Administrator, to make comments on this Resolution.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this Resolution would authorize an agreement to clear up some confusion over the years regarding the right of way to the railroad in Tatum. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that Mr. Harry Easterling, Jr., the county attorney, had a conflict with this since the question affected one of his clients. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that he asked Attorney Heath Ruffner of Chesterfield County to review the matter and provide the county with a written opinion so that there would not be any conflict. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that Attorney Ruffner has provided his written opinion and stated that he thought the confusion arose from a scrivener's error and that by signing this agreement the county would not be giving up anything but just confirming the distance of the right of way.

Chairman Steen asked if there if there were any questions. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Verd Odom, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve Resolution # 08-17-01 – a Resolution to Authorize Marlboro County to Execute a Boundary Line Agreement to Confirm the Width of a Railroad Right of Way Easement. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

RESOLUTION # 08-17-02 – A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION BY MARLBORO COUNTY AIRPORT GRANT FROM FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$501,517 AND AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT GRANT IF AWARDED

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, County Administrator, to make comments on this Resolution.

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Mr. Munnerlyn stated that this grant process for the airport was done annually and this year the county was eligible for grant funds from the FAA to construct a new hangar at the county airport. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that all the hangars at the airport were rented out. He stated that there was a match of around \$50,000 that would come from the Economic Development funds.

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that he had been making a real effort to have the airport commission members more involved with actions like this and stated that Councilman Midgley's father, Charles P. Midgley, Sr., was the Chairman on the Airport Commission, and Dr. John Nobles was also a member of this commission.

Mr. Willie Gladden stated that we were fortunate to get this grant and that an additional 500 feet would be added to the landing strip and that would be a big deal for Marlboro County.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

**Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve Resolution # 08-17-02 – a Resolution Authorizing Submission of an Application by Marlboro County for Airport Grant from Federal Aviation Administration in the Amount of \$501,517 and Authorization to Accept Grant if Awarded. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

REVIEW OF AUDIT PROPOSAL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017 FROM SHEHEEN, HANCOCK AND GODWIN, LLP

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Ms. Ainsley Moore, Finance Director, to make comments on this item.

Ms. Moore stated that she had received an engagement letter from Sheheen, Hancock and Godwin, LLP for auditing services for fiscal year ending 2017. She stated that the contract amount being considered was in the amount of \$26,400 and also included \$500 for estimated "extra charges" for out of pocket fees such as meals, copies, processing, etc. Ms. Moore stated that this amount was less than the amount that the previous firm charged for auditing services. She also stated that this same firm was used last year and they worked well with this firm. She recommended approving this proposal.

Chairman Steen asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

**Motion made by Ms. Corrie Plato, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve the audit proposal for fiscal year 2016-2017 from Sheheen, Hancock and Godwin, LLP in the amount of \$26,400 as well as estimated "extra charges" for out of pocket fees such as meals, copies, processing, etc. which are estimated not to exceed \$500. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.**

APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, asked if there were appointments to Boards and Commissions.

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There were no recommended appointments.

## REPORTS

### FINANCE DEPARTMENT – MS. AINSLEY MOORE

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Ms. Ainsley Moore, Finance Director.

Ms. Moore stated that for the month of July, expenditures were at 6% of the budgeted amount and revenues were at 2%. She stated that revenue collections were generally low during the first few months of each fiscal year but would normally even out with expenditures once tax collections begin.

Ms. Moore stated that staff met with the auditors at the end of July and the auditors have begun their preliminary fieldwork for the fiscal year 2017 annual audit. She stated that the auditors would be reviewing the information that they have gathered so far and would be returning in October for two weeks to continue the audit process.

Ms. Moore asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Chairman Steen thanked Ms. Moore for the financial report.

### ADMINISTRATOR’S REPORT – MR. RON MUNNERLYN, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, recognized Mr. Ron Munnerylyn, County Administrator.

Mr. Munnerylyn stated that his report was as follows:

**EMPLOYEE SERVICE ANNIVERSARIES** - The following employees were recognized with five or more years of service to Marlboro County through the month of July: Clara Brock (6 years); Keith Hughes (5 years); Tonya Jackson (20 years); Katherine Leggett (30 years); Tammy Perkins (30 years); Will Rogers (10 years); Sharon Sanders (6 years); Lashawn Wheeler (15 years); Sandy Wilkes (23 years); and Nehemiah Williams (21 years).

### **UPCOMING EVENTS & REMINDERS**

1. **Marlboro County Industry Appreciation Day** – Mr. Munnerylyn stated that IAD has been scheduled for September 14, 2017 and would return to the more casual, less formal format of years past. He stated that this year’s event would have two concurrent activities hosted, a dove shoot for hunters, and a captain’s choice golf tournament. Both would be followed by a casual outdoor BBQ “pig picking” dinner at a cabin near the dove hunting site and there would be no long formal program but only brief remarks and recognition of the top golfers and hunters. A schedule of events has been provided to members of Council and more information will be provided on this event.

## **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REPORT**

### Marlboro County Rail Tour

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that a positive feedback was received from industry, as well as state and regional economic development partners regarding the Rail Tour we held on July 27<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Munnerlyn thanked members of Council for their support and attendance. He stated that this event was a part of the renewed focus of our economic development efforts.

### Prospect Activity

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that since the last meeting, there have been three new prospect inquiries in addition to visits. These visits represent approximately 250 jobs and \$30 million in investment. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that he learned today that one of the projects we were working on had made the decision to locate in North Carolina. He stated that he was working to obtain feedback from the prospect as to the reasons for their decision.

### Available buildings

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that there was still a lot of interest in the Baldor building in Clio which was indicative of the need for marketable buildings in the county. He stated that there were several existing buildings but that the county must be realistic about their marketability. Low ceiling heights, condition of roofs and total square footage are important factors. He stated that it was important to mention that ALL existing buildings in the county were being marketed and were on the websites of Marlboro County, NESAs and the Department of Commerce. Mr. Munnerlyn stated that he was working with staff to update the "data sheets" for all buildings. These sheets show facts important to a project in the initial review of sites. He stated that much was now done on the internet and that it was important to have all information where it could be easily accessible.

## **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

### Bond-funded Renovations

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that staff was beginning to kick off the renovation projects that would be funded by the refinance of the general obligation bond. He stated that this would be a team effort with Building Maintenance, Finance and Administration working together to manage the project. In order to keep track of progress and the financial aspects, Ms. Bundy has received training in the use of MS Project which is the software used by most organizations for project management. He stated that by using this software and regular team meetings he hoped to make the maximum number of repairs possible with the limited funds available.

### Museum and Cultural Affairs Director

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that staff has received more than 25 applications for the position of the Museum and Cultural Affairs Director and will begin the interview process soon. This job requires a 4 – year degree as well as demonstrated experience and success in a related field.

Goals – Department and Individual

Mr. Munnerlyn stated that he was working with department heads to develop goals both for their departments and individual goals. These goals are important to guiding our work as an organization within the policies and budget approved by County Council. He stated that he would begin to implement metrics or KPI's(key performance indicators) to measure progress towards employees goals and their overall performance.

He stated that hopefully by the end of FY2017-18, employees would be evaluated on an annual basis and part of their salary increases (when available) would be determined by performance.

RECOGNITION OF CITIZEN'S REQUEST BEFORE COUNCIL

Mr. Jason Steen, Chairman, stated that no citizens had requested to address Council.

RECOGNITION OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

**Mr. Anthony Woods** - stated that August 14<sup>th</sup> was a special day for the Woods family. He stated that his grandmother, Ms. Lula Mae Woods, celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday last year and Council presented her with a Proclamation. He stated that he was pleased to say that his grandmother was celebrating her 101<sup>st</sup> birthday today and the family had a big dinner to celebrate with her last night. He stated that she has ten children and all ten were there as well as the grands and great-grands. He stated that his grandmother's oldest child is 81 and the youngest is 57. He stated that he was very blessed to still have her and that she has her right mind and knows everyone. He stated that five generations were at the celebration event last night.

**Ms. Corrie Plato** – stated that there is something to be said about a person living to see their 101<sup>st</sup> birthday and she believes that the person who lives this long has done something good for their life to be spared that long. She stated that she hoped that she would live to be that old.

Ms. Plato stated that Mr. Munnerlyn was doing an excellent job with the county and was making great changes.

Ms. Plato thanked Mr. Hale for attending the meeting and for his comments. She stated that there were many places in the area that needed to be cleaned up but that she would really love to see the Firestone community cleaned up and an apartment complex placed there. She stated that it takes much money to do great things but she assured Mr. Hale that whatever could be done to that area would be done and Mr. Munnerlyn would see to it.

**Mr. Charles P. Midgley, Jr.** – thanked Mr. Hale for attending the meeting and for his comments. He stated that he completely agreed.

**Mr. Willie Gladden** – thanked members of Council for being they were and stated that it was nice that they could all agree to disagree when they did not see eye to eye. He stated that he felt that all of them worked together well. He stated that the City of Bennettsville

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Council runs racial lines but that Marlboro County Council did not do that. He stated that he was proud of the way that Marlboro County Council conducts its business.

Mr. Gladden stated that he was getting ready to let the public know about things going on with Lake Paul Wallace and the County Transportation Committee. He stated that he would like for the news reporter to come in and look at the problems that we are having and educate the public. He stated that the Marlboro County Legislative Delegation does not care about Marlboro County and they bring nothing to the table. He stated that the county is going down with back road deals.

**Mr. Steve Blackmon** – stated that he was glad to know that members of Council work well together. He stated that every member does his/her best and have the best interest of the county at heart.

**Mr. Verd Odom** – stated that one of his constituents, Ms. Clara Cowick, celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday on August 12<sup>th</sup>. He stated that he worked with Ms. Cowick handling absentee ballots and he was happy that she was doing well.

Mr. Odom stated that he enjoyed the few months that he has served on Council and agreed that Council was made up of a good group of people. He agreed that every Council member does have the best interest of the citizens at heart.

Mr. Odom stated that he along with the other Council members attended the SC Association of Counties' annual conference in Hilton Head recently and had a great time.

**Mr. Jason Steen** – thanked Mr. Munnerlyn for the rail tour and stated that it helps to take a step back and look at things. He stated that he appreciated everything that Mr. Munnerlyn had done so far and felt that the county was moving forward. Mr. Steen stated that Council would continue to support him. He agreed that Marlboro County Council was unified and that the Council has the best interests of the county at heart.

Mr. Steen congratulated Ms. Lula Mae Woods on her 101<sup>st</sup> birthday and Ms. Clara Cowick on her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Mr. Steen stated that he felt the Solid Waste Fee would be a good thing for Marlboro County. He stated that we want the county cleaned up. He thanked Mr. Hale for appearing and speaking regarding the Solid Waste Fee Ordinance during the public hearing. Mr. Steen stated that it would take everyone working together to make Marlboro County a better place.

The Honorable Benjy Rogers, Marlboro County Auditor, complimented Council members on the way that they conducted their business and stated that he was proud of the way business was conducted at tonight's meeting.

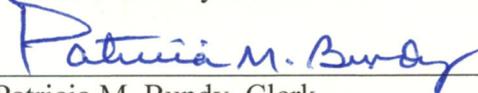
